Artist Statement

The juxtaposition of two scenes in "Redwoods Legacy" presents my fear of missing out on realizing my lifelong dream to hike through the serene redwood and sequoia forests in the American northwest before they are mostly destroyed by logging, drought, and fire. The two physical sides of this 'painting' also nod to the tension in dualities between human influence on and celebration of the natural world, showing scars as a testament to the resilience and covering them, and the fragility of stability.
