### **Breakout Session Topics**

**Note:** Each breakout session listed above has 4-5 topic options (A, B, C, D, E), you will select, and attend one of the 4-5. For your convenience we have repeat sessions on several of the topics. Please select the topic that best fits the information you are looking for.

Listed below you will find the topic descriptions.

**Student Registration and Financial:** An overview of your financial aid, the refund process, book vouchers, your student bill, billing dates, etc.

**Student Life:** What opportunities are available to you and how to get involved on campus. An overview of the Student Life offices to include: Student Activities, Community Service & Student Conduct, Greek Life & International, Retention, Transition and Career Services.

**Campus Resources:** An informative session on services available for students with disabilities including; accommodations, advocacy, organizational planning, ADA laws, and other coordinated services will be presented. An overview of the accompanying services provided through the Academic and Human Development Department including: Academic Advising, Counseling, Learning Support, Tutoring, Supplemental Instruction, Athletic Academic Mentoring, Minority Mentoring, Qualifying Program, and Comprehensive academic advising and support for students on academic probation will also be discussed in depth. Faculty will be on hand to answer and parent/ guardian questions in regards to the aforementioned services.

**Mountie Student ID Card:** An overview of the various uses of your ID Card (One Card), how to load money, where and what your ID card can be used for.

**Campus Technologies:** An overview of your campus accounts, email, campus computer requirements, internet usage guidelines, etc.

**Police Services:** An overview of campus transportation, parking on campus, police services, safety, and our drug and alcohol policy.

**Housing 101:** How do I register for housing and what are my options?

**Housing 201:** I'm registered for campus housing, now what? Information on what to bring and what to expect upon move in. Review of health forms requirements and the on campus clinic.

**Commuter Involvement:** An overview of how to get involved as a commuter student and the available spaces/lounges on campus.

**Dining:** An overview of our dining facilities, meal plans and equivalencies, hours of operation, party packs, and much more.

**Work Study:** An overview of how to get a job on campus and the eligibility and application process.

**Student Athletics:** This session offers helpful information for prospective and recruited athletes on and off the field.
